7. Spend some time familiarizing yourself with the CPL Resources online. They are very helpful when you are completing the components of your CPL Portfolio. The CPL Portfolio has 3 components. They include:
1. Self-Assessment Tool (Parts 1,2,3)
  2. Professional Learning Plan
  3. Record of Professional Learning

Self-Assessment Tool Part 1- #1- reflection questions for you. Only you can answer these questions for yourself.

#1- what things impact your work?

Think about your role...responsibilities.... daily practice...new experiences.

Consider.... New opportunities ... challenges ... changes in the sector.

8. Start a CPL working group with your colleagues. You could meet once a month at lunch time or after work. You could also make the group one of your CPL goals.
9. Set aside a time when you can work on the required components of the CPL (Self-Assessment, Professional Learning Planned, Recording Professional Learning). It does take some time to complete the different sections of the CPL but once that is completed then working on your goals is not as time consuming.
