Resource Lending Library & Membership

Membership Services

- 172 programs with group members, encompassing 836 educators

Resource Lending Library

The ECCDC's lending library makes it possible for early learning and child care programs of any size and budget to access innovative, high-quality learning resources and classroom equipment items. Niagara's children benefit tremendously from this and Niagara's early years educators love being able to offer them meaningful learning opportunities in exceptional indoor and outdoor learning environments. The ECCDC's carefully chosen collection includes highly specialized items that are aligned with the Provincial early learning frameworks and suitable for use with children of varying ages and abilities. Each of the resource items we offer supports an open-ended, emergent planning approach and stimulates children's imaginations, promotes language and cognitive development and facilitates social and emotional growth. We encourage members to *mess about* with materials before offering them to children to support their explorations.

Workroom & Learning Café

- 1,897 on-site visits
- 5 group tours offering equipment and resource highlights
- 2,928 service hours provided

Educators, volunteers and others involved in Niagara's early learning and child care community utilize the ECCDC's workroom tools and equipment to design exceptional learning environments and engaging experiences for Niagara's children. The warm, relaxed atmosphere of the ECCDC's Learning Café enables educators to share ideas and expertise, network, and participate in informal professional learning and meetings.

Resource Library and Workroom Exclusive Use Bookings

The ECCDC helps increase the knowledge base of Niagara's early years educators and the cohesiveness of its educator teams by making the ECCDC's Resource Library, Workroom and Learning Café available for special training, program planning and resource events. Wednesday evenings are set aside for this purpose, with ECCDC group members invited to book the facilities in advance for the exclusive use of their staff and volunteers. Amazing things result when Niagara's early learning programs have such convenient access to the latest resources, research materials and curriculum planning documents.

Grab `N Go Learning Activities

- 3 "Grab 'N Go" campaigns developed
- Over 84 new learning experiences shared

ECCDC's Grab 'N Go Activities facilitate quick, engaging early learning experiences for children. Each

Professional Learning Opportunities for Early Learning & Child Care Professionals

Meeting the needs of Early Childhood Educators, Full Day Early Learning Teams, Family Support Staff, Resource Teachers, Administrators, Early Years Professionals and Students, means that the ECCDC delivers community training sessions throughout the year. Events taking place between April 1, 2014 and March 31, 2015 included:

- 97 community-wide institutes, seminars, and training sessions
- 3,525 participants in attendance
- 247 professional learning hours delivered
- 107,501 views to Esteem on the ECCDC website

Collaborative Events

In the fall of 2014, the ECCDC kicked off the professional development series: *Cultivating Natural Playgrounds that Nurture Children's Curiosity and Wonder*. Approximately 300 educators attended, in part due to the mounting body of research that emphasizes the vital role that nature plays in helping children develop their problem-solving, critical thinking and social and emotional skills. This unique training offering was made possible through the ECCDC's partnership with Bienenstock Natural Playgrounds. It was designed to help Niagara's educators enhance their understanding about how they can safely provide children with diverse opportunities for unstructured exploration of the natural environment. Participants were enthusiastic and engaged in the workshop materials and were motivated to begin making changes within their own outdoor spaces. As

a follow up, the ECCDC launched a special resource section on the eccdc.org website to share key learning, resources, funding advice, website links and other useful information, so that all early years programs can explore ways to deliver enhanced, nature-based educational opportunities.



In November 2014, the ECCDC partnered with Brock University, Niagara College, the District School Board of Niagara and the Niagara Catholic District School Board to present a special collaborative professional learning opportunity facilitated by Karen Calligan and Rod Peturson of the Ontario Ministry of Education. Entitled *Reflecting Upon How Does Learning Happen: A Focus on Relationships*, this event attracted 211 professionals from numerous agencies involved in Niagara's early years sector.

Enhancing Professionalism, Innovation and Success continued

On December 5 and 6, 2014 and February 27 and 28, 2015 the ECCDC featured two institutes; a *Pedagogical Leadership Institute* and *Infant and Toddler Institute*. Lorrie Baird and Anne Marie Coughlin of Harvest Resources facilitated each of these two-day conferences. The institutes attracted 131 participants and were very positively received. Participants reported having many opportunities to engage in conversations related to the practice of daily reflection, inspiring leadership at all levels, and the competencies of infants and toddlers. Participants also reported that the sessions gave them a greater understanding of the four foundations outlined in the Ministry of Education document *How Does Learning Happen?*

In January 2015, the ECCDC was thrilled to partner with Dad Central, Strive Niagara, Niagara Region Public Health and Niagara Region Children's Services to offer *Welcoming Dads*. The event provided participants with a toolkit and strategies for developing plans, policies and supports to



promote the inclusion of fathers in community-based organizations involved in early years services. There were 102 participants in attendance. As a result of this session, a local Fathering Network is being developed and the organizations involved will be supported in implementing the toolkit.

Niagara Infant Mental Health Pilot Project Kick-off

In March of 2015, the ECCDC teamed up with Strive Niagara, Niagara Region Children's Services, the Infant Mental Health Program of Toronto SickKids Hospital and Niagara Child Care Sector Executive to launch Niagara's Infant Mental Health Pilot Project. The launch event attracted 53 community

partners and featured presentations by Dr. Robin Williams, Associate Chief Medical Officer of Health for the Province of Ontario; Dr. Chaya Kulkarni of Toronto SickKids Hospital; Commissioner of Children's Services Katherine Chislett; and Infant Mental Health Committee Members Sandy Toth, Tracy Belcastro, Laura Rasmussen and Lorrey Arial Bonilla. This event helped increase awareness of the effects of toxic stress on infant brain development and offered insight into how families, caregivers, educators and service providers can help reduce this stress. It also marked the piloting of the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) and the Ages and Stages Questionnaire - Social Emotional (ASQ SE) in early learning and child care programs across Niagara.

Customized Training for Local Early Learning and Child Care Organizations

- 9 customized sessions were delivered
- 284 participants attended

During the year, the ECCDC offered a variety of innovative professional learning opportunities that were customized to meet the specific needs of many early learning and child care agencies. The sessions took place at the locations chosen by the host sites and were facilitated directly to staff teams.

Celebrating Niagara's Early Learning and Child Care Community

- 368 participants attended the celebration
- 49 recognition awards were presented
- 10 local businesses sponsored the event
- 68 local silent auction donors contributed items

In the nearly 20 years since its inception, Niagara's annual Early Learning and Child Care Awards of Excellence Celebration has grown to become one of the largest events of its kind in the country. The ECCDC is proud of the unique history and continued growth of this event. A special thank you to Louise Kool & Galt and the Association of Early Childhood Educators of Ontario, both of which have been long-time supporters of Niagara's Awards of Excellence program.

The theme for the 2014 gala was "Niagara's EPIC Journey of Success." The event took place on November 20, with local radio personality Lori Love from 105.7 FM serving as emcee. Members of the ECCDC board of directors, its executive director, the Niagara Region Commissioner of Community Services and Director of Children's Services, and numerous other community partners helped with the hosting duties.

In March 2014, the ECCDC in partnership with Niagara Region Children's Services, Brock University and Speech Services Niagara, launched an iPad® Project that saw iPads[®] being trialled with 26 educators from child care programs across Niagara Region. The ECCDC supported the facilitation of four training sessions offered through Speech Services Niagara and the Brock University Research Team. Program Support for Early Learning and Child Care Programs

- 56 program/centre visits made
- Over 800 early learning staff supported

One of the most important ways the ECCDC contributes to the stability of early learning and child care programs in Niagara and facilitates their ongoing success is through on-site visits to centres. These visits are customized to the specific needs and goals articulated by each centre team. ECCDC staff may provide advice for indoor or outdoor room design, curriculum planning, team building or observation and documentation strategies. ECCDC team members also share expertise in strategic planning, board development, program administration, financial management, engaging families and developing respectful and ethical relationships.

Community Professional Network Development

- 20 professional network sessions were facilitated
- 287 network participants engaged

ECCDC staff provided coordination and facilitation services to the following network groups: Child Care Supervisors, Child Care Francophone Supervisors, Child Care Cooks, Co-op Teachers, Resource Teachers and Emergent Practice.

Quality Child Care Niagara Training

- 18 training sessions coordinated
- 380 participants attended the training sessions
- 91 visits to programs to support the implementation of QCCN were completed.
- 1,200 QCCN website views and support in submitting statistical information 56 times

In December 2014, the ECCDC was pleased to present A Celebration of *Quality Child Care Niagara: Reflecting on the Past, Embracing the Present and Shaping the Future.* This celebration of the 10th anniversary of Quality Child Care Niagara featured a keynote address on leadership, by Ontario's Assistant Deputy Minister of Education, Jim Grieve. It also provided Niagara's early years educators with opportunities to reflect upon the changes needed to align their work with *How Does Learning Happen?*

Quality Child Care Niagara (QCCN) enhances the quality of licensed child care programs in Niagara, using a standardized, research-based approach. The ECCDC and Niagara Region Children's Services have worked together to coordinate QCCN for over a decade. We thank all of our community partners who develop and regularly facilitate a variety of QCCN training modules and who bring their insights and ideas to the Advisory Committee. Earlier this year, the ECCDC, Niagara Region Children's Services and a committee of community partners began meeting to integrate *How Does Learning Happen?* into QCCN.

Increasing Accessibility of Resources and Training Through Special Projects

Licensed Child Care Science and Technology Project Funding from the Ontario Trillium Foundation enabled the ECCDC to continue coordinating the two-year Science and Technology Project it had undertaken

in partnership with the Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara and Louise Kool and Galt. The ECCDC is grateful to the Ontario Trillium Foundation for supporting this valuable project.

- 18 Kiwanis Club members contributed over 150 hours compiling the kits as well as providing a rental facility to store the materials for two years and moving vans to deliver materials to the hotel venues as required.
- 31 Science and Technology training sessions were offered in Welland, St. Catharines, and Niagara Falls.
- Over 93 hours of training was delivered through the Early Childhood Community Development Centre.
- 861 staff of licensed child care programs attended the training sessions.
- Over \$900 of science materials were included within the kits at no cost to programs.
- More than a \$40 value in training and materials were provided at no cost to programs.

Intergenerational Project for Preschool Children and Seniors

The purpose of the Intergenerational Pilot Project was to develop and trial tools that child care programs may utilize to establish intergenerational programs within local seniors' residences, in order to promote positive relationships and learning opportunities between children and seniors.

The ECCDC sought funding for the pilot project and was successful in being the recipient of a \$25,000 grant through New Horizons for Seniors Program of the Government of Canada. The New Horizons for Seniors Program is a federal Grants and Contributions program that supports projects led or inspired by seniors who

make a difference in the lives of others and in their communities.

Four visits took place at the senior residence locations from January to April 2015 with approproximately eight



seniors and eight preschool children visiting one another during each session. The visits were planned to be one hour in length and included a variety of sensory materials. To facilitate engaging activities, the child care centres and seniors' residences brought along materials from their Intergenerational Preschool Backpacks and Seniors' Information Packs to be used by the children and seniors in small groups. Links to Ontario's Early Learning Framework, *How Does Learning Happen?* were considered during the development of the program materials to ensure the visits aligned with Ontario's early years pedagogy.

The ECCDC extends sincere thanks to the Government of Canada's New Horizons for Seniors Program for supporting this heartwarming project.

Supporting Families in Finding Early Years Services

Parent Direct Niagara

Launched in 2012, Parent Direct Niagara (www. parentdirectniagara.ca) is a Niagara-based web portal, designed to make it easier for parents to find information about programs and services for children and families. The website allows parents in Niagara to search for a wide variety of programs and services. This was made possible through the support of the Ontario Trillium Foundation, Niagara Community Foundation, the Early Years Niagara Planning Council and Niagara Region Children's Services. Relaunched in 2014 through funding from the Niagara Community Integration Leader Project (CIL Project), part of the website was updated to include some of the website text, listings, and subcategories; made the website mobile-friendly; upgraded search capabilities; and added a consolidated Community Events Calendar and Resource Page for parents. The entire platform was also recreated in French through the support of the Niagara Community Foundation.

- There were 139,486 visits to the website, an average of 10,790 visits per month or 961 per day
- The ECCDC engaged in a March break marketing blitz where 60 new listings were added to Parent Direct Niagara and over three thousand families and agencies received postcards and a promotional email

Computer Technical Support

• 101 Programs Supported

The ECCDC helped Niagara's early learning and child care programs keep pace with technology by offering consultations on common hardware and software concerns, upgrades, repairs, and security issues. Additionally, in the summer of 2014, the ECCDC received funding through Niagara Region Children's Services for the purchase of laptops, printers/scanners and wireless routers for use in the area's licensed child care programs. A survey was developed to determine community need. Seventy-five programs received new IT bundles along with group training and on-site one-to-one training on how to use the new equipment. The project began in the fall of 2014, with installations completed by the end of December. The training took place in the winter of 2015.

Niagara Child Care Sector Executive and Inclusive Child Care Supports Committees

- The Niagara Child Care Sector Executive Committee web page was viewed 486 times
- The Inclusive Child Care Supports Committee web page was viewed 848 times

The ECCDC contributes to the success of these important community committees by providing professional administrative supports, including the maintenance of minutes, reports and file archives in Web-accessible formats, email distribution, document design, updating webpages and sending out community messages.

Work Experience for Students of Early Childhood Education Programs

• 7 student internship placements hosted

The ECCDC regularly hosts work placements for the Niagara College Early Childhood Education Department and the Brock University Bachelor of Early Childhood Education and Child Studies Programs. This year, we were also pleased to host an accounting student through the Goodman School of Business. These placements help build a sense of connection between students studying in Niagara and Niagara's early learning and child care community, providing the students with skills and contacts that will enhance their careers.

Helping to Inform the Early Learning and Child Care Sector

During the year, the ECCDC distributed close to 100 bulk emails on behalf of the Ministry of Education, Niagara Region Children's Services and/or Niagara Region Public Health and the Niagara Child Care Sector Executive. These messages helped keep Niagara's early learning and care providers informed about new research, sector-wide changes and upcoming events.

New Innovative and Informative Web Page

- www.eccdc.org received 107,501 visits
- There were almost 100 percent more pages viewed on average per month, since the launch of the new website compared to the last two years' monthly viewing averages

The ECCDC Team worked diligently during the Spring and Summer of 2014 to redesign www.eccdc.org. The site was officially re-launched in October 2014 and featured a new E-Store and online registration module. The new website better highlights the ECCDC's onsite facilities and learning café, membership benefits, and coaching and support services; particularly the areas of environmental design, pedagogy and curriculum and professionalism.



The announcements page continues to keep the community informed about important initiatives, services and legislative changes.


