Welcome to the 2019/2020 Community Impact Report



Although this report covers accomplishments from April 2019 to March 31, 2020, it seems like a lifetime ago. We have experienced an unprecedented year across the early learning and child care sector and in all industries around the world. Despite the challenging time we all have experienced this year, our Board and Staff Team at the ECCDC are reminded of so many exciting initiatives the ECCDC was thrilled to be a part of in 2019 and within the early part of 2020.

The ECCDC was proud to support professional learning opportunities in our home base of Niagara along with many communities across the Province, including: Ottawa, North Bay, Thunder Bay, Orillia, Toronto, Oxford, Peel, Magnetawan, Newmarket, Sudbury, Barrie, Durham, Algoma, Grey County, Muskoka, St. Thomas, Dryden, Coburg, Parry Sound and Bruce County. Within and outside of Niagara, we interacted with over 8,000 participants through our training programs in 2019. Additionally, we were honoured to be a part of the Métis Nation of Ontario Early Learning and Child Care Conference in March 2020, interacting with 160 Educators. This was a new and unique experience for our Staff Team and one that we were very privileged to be a part of.

We also had the exciting opportunity to host close to 300 educators from across the province right in our own backyard in Niagara, to see world renowned author-educators Susan Stacy who offered a session on Inquiry Based Learning Environments as well as a book signing and workshop with Ann Pelo in launching her book Educators as Protagonists.

Supporting Niagara's programs in transforming their playgrounds into natural play spaces continued to be a focus across our early learning community and the ECCDC Team finalized the local playground naturalization project by hosting 26 programs to celebrate the launch of their natural play spaces with a keynote presentation given by wellknown and highly respected author and play space designer Rusty Keeler, with an opening and welcome from local landscape design leader Adam Bienenstock of Bienenstock Natural Playgrounds.

While it seems like our 25th organizational anniversary flew by quickly, we were happy to celebrate by sending thank you letters expressing gratitude to our funders, partners, business supporters, and local elected officials and we offered a series of free workshops and library draws for our stakeholders. We were excited to offer 25 Tips for Engaging Learning with Loose Parts offered by our good friends Jen Smith and Rose Gentilcore of the District School Board of Niagara and the Niagara Catholic District School Board, 25 Ways to Boost Your Board with longstanding supporter Gay Douglas, 25 Ways to Promote Literacy in the Playground led by our colleague and friend Jill Bienenstock, and 25 Tried and True Forest School Experiences presented by the nature oriented Team at Rosalind Blauer Centre for Child Care. We couldn't have been more grateful for our friends and colleagues who offered these sessions and our many business partners who supported refreshments.

Within the resource library and organizational support services we were pleased to deliver hundreds of resources and do-it-yourself, play-based pick up and play resources. We were also excited to offer board support and supervisor mentor support to programs inside and outside of Niagara, more frequently than ever before. We also embarked on the ambitious plan of relocating our offices. Planning and renovating a new office space began in the Fall of 2019 and ended up being put on hold in early 2020, as the Pandemic unfolded.

Lastly, at the end of 2019 we launched a stakeholder survey which provided insight into several new areas of interest to our stakeholders, including offering webinars, providing membership opportunities for those who don't wish to borrow resources or live at a distance, as well as expanding awareness of our program support services which include board development guidance, financial bookkeeping human resource advice, supervisor team building support, workplace health and wellness, and a host of topics in between. We are currently developing our next strategic plan and look forward to working harder to further expanding these stakeholder priorities, while ensuring that we remain flexible and accommodating as the world of early learning and child care continues to shift and change.

It surely has been a journey and all of us at the ECCDC are so pleased to be able to support you in your most important work. We look forward to serving you on the next part of our journey together, as we navigate new waters together.




