# How has Young Children Priority First supported Niagara's licensed child care programs?

# Licensed Child Care Program Numeracy Project 2010/2012

One hundred and fifty (150) licensed child care programs in Niagara each received a numeracy resource kit and training valued at over \$1,000. A \$132,000 grant was received from the Ontario Trillium Foundation and \$30,000 was directly contributed through Niagara's Kiwanis Clubs.

# Science and Technology Project 2014/2015

One hundred and seventy-five (175) licensed child care programs in Niagara received science and technology learning kits valued at over \$900. This project happened thanks to a two-year, \$150,000 grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, the Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara and the Early Childhood Community Development Centre.

### **Intergenerational Project 2014**

This project aimed at making it easier for child care centres and seniors homes to offer intergenerational programming. This project was made possible by a \$25,000 grant from the New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP). This project had representatives from Niagara's early learning and child care community and local seniors programs to pilot the project.

### **Outlast Blocks Project 2017-2019**

Twenty-six (26) early learning and child care programs in Niagara received a set of *Community Playthings - Outlast Blocks* thanks to a \$45,000 donation made by the Kiwanis Clubs. Outlast Blocks are specially designed to encourage creative play and child-directed discovery and contributes to rich outdoor experiences for children.
